And not only the new year, but also the beginning of WAGGGS Centenary .

The planning team consists of international trainers and leaders, all very experienced and ready to bring you the excitement of this international opportunity!

If you are a group of 4-8 guides and scouts (girls and/or boys), aged 14-18 years and followed by a leader, minimum 18 years old, you can participate. When on site, you'll work in international patrols, get to learn the other participants and make connections across Europe!

The program offers variable challenges and possibilities, the only effort is choosing which to join! Outdoor activities as climbing, skiing, snow fight, winter hikes and igloo making are on your list – **Have you ever slept in a snow house, or under a bare moon?** – Artistic program where you can express yourself in every imaginable way, design your own clothes or make a revie, participate in workshops about topics important to you and make your own TV-announcements, learn to use the media as a tool for your projects or make your own souvenirs as mugs and paint on T-shirts. You'll also have the chance to learn about the work and goals of WAGGGS worldwide and how you can impact this; you will discover the new Global Action Theme, WAGGGS involvement in international affairs and also talk online with many members of WAGGGS worldwide. You can choose to run a café for one night, or organise the New Year Celebration, compete with the other patrols in a wild game or visit the surrounding areas of the center, but most importantly, you have the chance to meet people from all over Europe and learn to know and work in this international environment. - **Do you know how to say Good Morning in Icelandic?** – *
